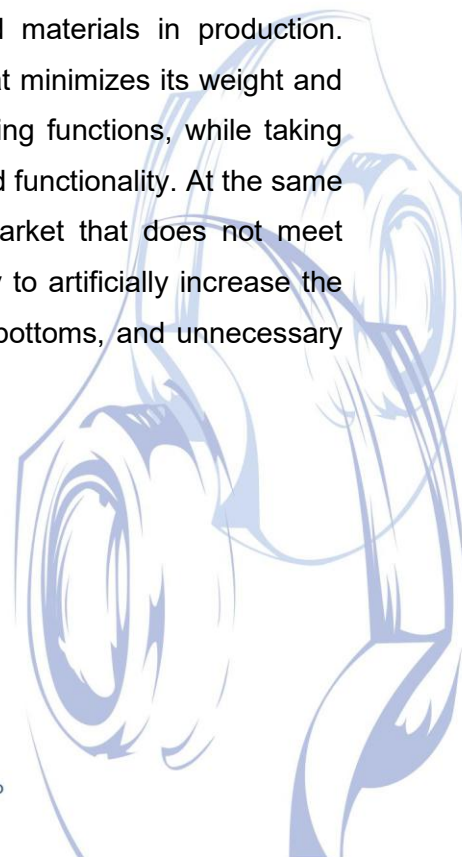
Re: the obligation to ensure that the packaging supplied complies with the requirements of Regulation (EU) 2025/40 (PPWR)

Dear Sir or Madam,

In connection with the approaching effective date—August 12, 2026—of Regulation (EU) 2025/40 of the European Parliament and of the Council of December 19, 2024, on packaging and packaging waste, amendments to Regulation (EU) 2019/1020 and Directive (EU) 2019/904, and repealing Directive 94/62/EC 9 (hereinafter referred to as the PPWR Regulation), we are writing to you as a supplier of packaging/packaging materials to request that you take the necessary compliance measures to ensure that the packaging you supply, its manufacturing process, and the related documentation comply with the requirements of the PPWR.

The supplier is required to ensure, in particular:

a) compliance with new obligations regarding packaging design, material composition, and the ability to ensure recycling as well as the use of recycled materials in production. Packaging should be designed and manufactured in a manner that minimizes its weight and volume to the extent necessary to maintain the required packaging functions, while taking into account requirements regarding product protection, safety, and functionality. At the same time, a ban is being proposed on placing packaging on the market that does not meet specific performance criteria or contains elements intended solely to artificially increase the perceived volume of the product, including double walls, double bottoms, and unnecessary layers,



- b) that packaging placed on the market be manufactured with the presence and concentration of potentially hazardous substances minimized as components of packaging materials or any parts of the packaging—including with regard to their occurrence in emissions and in any materials resulting from waste management, such as recyclables, ash, or other materials intended for final disposal—and the negative environmental impact caused by plastic microbeads,
- c) testing packaging for compliance with requirements regarding the content of hazardous substances, including heavy metals: lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent chromium, in a total amount not exceeding 100 mg/kg,
- d) providing all information and documentation necessary to demonstrate the compliance of the supplied packaging and packaging materials with the requirements of the PPWR Regulation, and if the supplier acts as a packaging manufacturer within the meaning of the PPWR, the supplier is required to ensure that the required conformity assessment procedure is carried out, that technical documentation is prepared, and that an EU Declaration of Conformity is drawn up in accordance with Articles 38 and 39 of the PPWR,
- e) to provide a copy of the EU Declaration of Conformity, as well as the documentation and information necessary to demonstrate compliance with the PPWR requirements, to the extent that these documents pertain to the packaging or packaging materials being supplied.

In light of the above, we are requesting that you, as our supplier, bring the packaging supplied to Polmotors Spółka z ograniczoną odpowiedzialnością, with its registered office in Mazańcowice, into compliance to the extent necessary by August 12, 2026, in accordance with the implementation schedule set forth in the PPWR Regulation, since, while the regulation applies as of August 12, 2026, specific obligations will come into effect gradually over the following years, depending on the particular requirement. In light of the above, please provide information on the status of your packaging's compliance with the specified requirements and on the planned schedule for implementing the changes, with sufficient advance notice to ensure compliance with the obligations under the PPWR.
